## The Age, 14 December 1937, p. 8, Aborigines' League. Framlingham Reserve Case

The Aborigines' League, of which Mr William Cooper is secretary, is taking up the cause of the Framlingham people. The league will hold a public meeting in Kelvin Hall, Collins-place, on Thursday at 8 p.m., and this important subject will be one of the matters to which publicity will be given. The half-caste people of Framlingham are living in miserable shacks, through no fault of their own. Apart from a few families whom the board recognises as eligible, they are forced to live outside the reserve. Two years ago, through representations made by Warrnambool citizens, the Chief Secretary promised to allow other half-caste families to take up land in the reserve in blocks of 10 acres, and the land was surveyed for the purpose. The league is anxious to know why this promise has not been fulfilled. At present the land is lying idle, whilst the people who have the greatest claim to the land are prevented from using it.
